28 Alexander T. Sack Professor of Functional Brain Stimulation and Neurocognitive Psychology at the Faculty of Psychology and Neuroscience, Maastricht University

In the recent years new technologies have risen, opening to a totally new approach to cognitive neurosciences: NIBS (Non Invasive Brain Stimulation) techniques are able to transiently interfere with the underlying cortical tissue allowing direct stimulation or modulation; fMRI is able to read the BOLD signal, which is related to hemodynamic changes of specific brain areas during a task. However spatial and/or temporal resolution are still critical limitations. A new method based on concurrent application of these technologies can be the key to deepen our sight on our brain "black box".
