

Activities and Structure of the Summer School

During the Summer School, we organized various activities to support the **design of Service Learning (SL) projects** across different European contexts.

- Morning sessions featured expert-led lectures focusing on key aspects of SL.
- Afternoon workshops provided guided, hands-on experiences in SL project design.
- Participants worked in groups and followed a structured model to identify and address the specific needs of their local communities.

Model for designing service learning paths



Day 1 - Welcome and Introduction

- Official Welcome and Opening Remarks by institutional representatives
- Presentation of the Summer School: objectives, structure, and pedagogical vision
- Introductory Lectures: setting the stage for Service Learning as an educational approach
- Participant Introductions: getting to know each other and sharing expectations







Day 2 - Start designing service learning

Morning sessions: Motivating Students through SL

- The Importance of Motivation in Service Learning (Exploring how SL fosters student engagement, personal growth, and active participation)
- Case Studies of SL in Italy and Around the World (Concrete examples of SL projects implemented in different cultural and educational contexts, highlighting best practices and impact)

Afternoon workshops: Designing a Service Learning Project

 In small groups, participants began planning their own SL initiatives, starting from real-world problems and applying a structured design model.









Day 3 - Soft Skills and Social Responsibility

- Morning sessions: SL as a tool for ethical and civic development
- Workshop: Conception and Planning
 Mapping of human resources (experts, school/university staff); Definition of required technical and professional skills; Establishing territorial/community partnerships; Development of a clear timeline of actions
- Phase 4: Execution (Focus on the practical implementation of the project)
- Projects gain external visibility; Collaboration with the local community takes shape



Day 4: Interdisciplinary Applications

Morning session: Discussion about ethics, AI, and e-Service Learning

Workshop Theatre of the Oppressed: Represent a Service Learning Project (Nonverbal Skit)

create and perform a **short, nonverbal theatrical scene** (2–3 minutes) that represents a situation related to a **service learning project**, including its **context, challenges, and values**.



Workshop Conclusion and Evaluation

Final phase focused on assessing the project's impact, analyzing the results achieved, and planning dissemination activities. It also includes the graphic design of the completed phases.

Day 5 - From Vision to Action: Implementing Service Learning

Final presentations: participants showcase their own SL project proposals
