 <p>Course Catalogue (SUA-CdS)</p>	<p>Defines the structure, learning outcomes, and educational methods of the degree program. Official reference for students, teachers, and stakeholders.</p>	<p>You can access it online to understand course structure, credits, and expected skills.</p>
 <p>Annual Self-Assessment Report (Scheda di Autovalutazione)</p>	<p>An internal report drafted each academic year by the faculty and QA Committee to evaluate strengths, weaknesses, and areas for improvement.</p>	<p>Your course evaluations contribute to this analysis.</p>
 <p>Student Opinion Surveys</p>	<p>Confidential questionnaires completed after each course. They assess teaching quality, clarity of materials, and learning workload.</p>	<p>You are encouraged to complete them to help improve the teaching experience.</p>
 <p>Joint Student-Teacher Committee (CPDS)</p>	<p>A body composed of students and teachers that monitors educational quality and collects feedback to propose improvements.</p>	<p>Your student representative reports your concerns and suggestions.</p>
 <p>Quality Assurance Committee (AQ Committee)</p>	<p>Implements QA policies, monitors indicators and coordinates improvement actions in the degree program.</p>	<p>It uses survey data and feedback to guide its proposals.</p>
 <p>Stakeholder Consultation</p>	<p>Involves external actors such as companies, institutions, and alumni to ensure that the program is aligned with the labor market.</p>	<p>You benefit from updated and relevant learning content.</p>
 <p>Improvement Plan</p>	<p>A structured list of actions based on data and feedback, approved by the Degree Program Board and monitored annually.</p>	<p>It may lead to updated courses, better resources, or new support services.</p>
