PREREQUISITES	Basic knowledge of Italian constitutional law and sources of law. Basic concepts and terminology related to human rights.
LEARNING OUTCOMES	<p>Knowledge and ability of comprehension: knowledge of the history, methods and values of the clinical approach to legal education, by questioning limits and potentialities of law and the role of law and jurists with respect to the enhancement of social justice; Drawing from the work of the Legal Clinic for Human Rights based at the University of Palermo, students will also comprehend the active social role that University can take in a specific territorial context; Knowledge and comprehension of procedural law concerning migrants rights and international protection; Comprehension of the system of the Italian courts concerning migration rights and international protection; Full comprehension of the comparative method.</p> <p>Applying knowledge and understanding: Ability to use acquired theoretical and practical instruments to identify, in front of concrete cases, which human rights violations are in place and how to intervene; Ability to critically considering the notions of access to justice, legal certainty, hierarchy of laws, universality and equality of fundamental rights; Ability to evaluate the due process of law in trials regarding legal rights of migrants and international protection.</p> <p>Making judgments: Ability to develop a critical approach about some evolving legal dynamics of access/exclusion/differential inclusion with respect to the effectiveness of human rights; Ability to develop an autonomous reasoning, with regard to both socio-legal contemporary context and scholarly opinions; Ability to make autonomous assessment on issues concerning protection of migrants and international protection, with respect to Italian and international law.</p> <p>Communication: Ability to use appropriately foreign words and to use different communicating skills - either orally or in written - in order to illustrate a legal case of violation of human rights; Ability to communicate in a clear and exhaustive way, and to give reasons in support of ones' ideas properly and convincingly.</p> <p>Learning skills: Ability able to apply the specific learning methods of legal clinics in order to enhance and update their skills in professional contexts.</p>
ASSESSMENT METHODS	<p>Oral or written examination aimed at ascertaining the level of knowledge of the subject matters.</p> <p>The evaluation will unfold as follows:</p> <p>Excellent (30 - 30 cum laude): good knowledge of the topics, excellent property of language, excellent capacity of analysis ; the student is able to apply theoretical knowledge to real cases which are proposed to be analysed;</p> <p>Very good (26 - 29): good knowledge of the topics, good properties of language, good analytical capacity; the student is able to apply theoretical knowledge to real cases which are proposed to be analysed;</p> <p>Good (24 - 25): Basic knowledge of the main topics, good property of language, the student shows limited ability' to apply theoretical knowledge to real cases which are proposed to be analysed;</p> <p>Satisfactory (21 - 23): the student does not show that complete command of the main teaching topics, although showing to know the basic knowledge; he/she shows satisfactory property of language albeit with a poor ability' to adequately apply theoretical knowledge to real cases which are proposed to be analysed;</p> <p>Sufficient (18 - 20): minimal knowledge of the main teaching and technical language issues, limited or no capacity to adequately apply theoretical knowledge to real cases which are proposed to be analysed;</p> <p>Not sufficient: the student does not have an acceptable knowledge of the contents of the various topics on the agenda;</p>

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES OF THE MODULE

Students will gain a general knowledge of the history, methods and values of the clinical approach to legal education, by questioning the role of law and jurists with respect to the enhancement of social justice. Drawing from the work of the Legal Clinic for Human Rights based at the University of Palermo, students will be confronted with concrete case of legal interventions to defend fundamental rights of people experiencing conditions of exclusion and vulnerability, by also comprehending the active social role that University can take in a specific territorial context. To this end, students will acquire the necessary instruments to critically considering the notions of access to justice, legal certainty, hierarchy of laws, universality and equality of fundamental rights.

SYLLABUS

Hrs	Frontal teaching
2	Supranational and national law: in particular, the consolidated act on migrants. Main institutes concerning criminal proceedings.
2	The criminal judicial system. The criminal trial of the foreigners: appointed by the State and lay judges.
2	Foreign person under investigation/accused and victim. The right to information and participation in criminal proceedings.
2	Interpretation and translation of documents.
2	The protection of personal freedom and several types of expulsion.
2	The executive stage and alternative measures to detention.
Hrs	Practice
1	Case law examination on: the main moments of the criminal proceedings on illegal migration.
1	Case law examination on the topic: the "direct judgment" for the foreigners before the Justice of the peace.
2	Case law examination on the topic: the right to the legal and linguistic assistance. Legal counsel/ judicial act.
1	Case law examination on the topic: Habeas corpus, arrest without "flagrante delicto status" and expulsion during the criminal proceedings.
