Following the times of domestic constitutionalization and international decolonization, law has faced a new adventure: the emergence of human rights. Their origins are rooted in the past, but only in the last decades they have become protagonist of the domestic and international scene. Their status, methods, and limits can now be observed appropriately.



Over the past 25 years, the University of Palermo has been engaged in the study of the cultural, social, political, and legal enterprise of protecting human rights. More than one hundred new Doctors have discussed their dissertations on different aspects of the practice of human rights and many Italian and international scholars, as well as human rights experts and practitioners in courts, institutions and NGOs, have been invited to discuss their scientific findings and professional experiences.
