PhD courses in "Human Rights: Evolution, Protection and Limits", "Legal pluralism. Ancient and current perspectives", "Dynamics of systems" and "Ecological transition", in collaboration with the Center for Sustainability and Ecological Transition and the Master in "Law and Technique of the Ecological Transition" of the University of Palermo, present the Winter School entitled: Energy transition and fundamental rights (hereinafter called: Winter School).

ART. 1 – GENERAL INDICATIONS

I – PREMISE

The Winter School will be dedicated to the protection of fundamental rights in the context of energy transition processes. In fact, it cannot be ignored how the serious climate crisis in progress and the increasingly difficult access to "traditional" sources, in its etiological pluralism, have imposed – and still impose – a rethinking of the methods of production, supply and consumption of energy. In the background of these processes arises the immanent presence of fundamental rights, which live an ambivalent relationship with the energy transition, between risks related to the excessive compression of protection and opportunities for their strengthening.

The interdisciplinary nature and transversality of the scientific comparison will therefore be the two essential components of the Winter School. It will be therefore traced an ideal path which, through the constant recourse to a human-based approach, will allow to test the mutual interference between energy transition and protection of rights, increasingly understood not as a mere negative limit of public policies, but as a renewed and univocal moment of finalistic fallout of the entire development path.

II – OBJECTIVES AND TOPICS

In order to try to examine the multiple questions posed from different angles, the Winter School will be articulated into three main moments.

- 1. Determination of the historical and technical-scientific background of reference. It is not possible to address the issue of energy transition with conscience without fully understanding the reasons that have contributed to placing the issue at the center of the political agendas of governments around the world. To this end, the contribution of different professionals of the technical-scientific area will prove how crucial it is to define the multiple co-interests between climate change and energy issues, as well as between the energy transition and the geographical, social, political and economic conditions in which certain regions, or the entire globe find themselves. The survey will therefore require an in-depth analysis of the prospects and the main critical issues of the use of renewable energy sources.
- 2. Human rights and energy policies. Once the general coordinates have been acquired, we will proceed with a reconstruction, both diachronic and synchronic, of the way in which governments have understood and declined energy transition policies. The survey will look at all levels, international, European and national.



Once objectives and solutions will be acquired, their real degree of effectiveness, the impact on the general levels of protection and the development of human rights will be considered.

3. *Human rights and energy transition put to the test: insights on some areas of interest.* All that remains is to question howhuman rights and the energy transition are in dialogue in certain areas of election. It will thus range from the regulation of energy markets, to urban planning profiles, with particular attention to energy communities. Again we will look with interest at the effects of energy transition policies on the protection of the landscape, and the crucial role played by national jurisdictions not only in the resolution of disputes concerning climate issues (the so-called *climate litigation*).

III - METHODOLOGY

As indicated in the attached programme, each day one or two sessions will be held and several specific topics will be discussed from various theoretical and practical perspectives, with the aim of achieving an effective integration of methods and solutions. Speakers will suggestmaterials to read in advance preparing participants to address the topics under discussion, facilitating a greater understanding and a more fruitful discussion of the topics covered. At the end of each seminar there will be a debate involving all the participants in the activities. In order to ensure the maximum involvement of PhD students, the work of the *Winter school* will include a *Workshop* entitled "*The energy transition between development prospects and dangers for the protection of fundamental rights: an interdisciplinary approach*", where the papers proposed and developed by some PhD students will be presented. IV – WORKING LANGUAGES

The work will take place in Italian, English and Spanish, according to the preference of the speakers and the composition of the audience.

ART. 2 – ADMISSION CONDITIONS

- **1.** As established byart. 4 of the *Regulations for the activation of International Courses of Advanced Studies "Summer and Winter School"* of the University of Palermo, can participate in the *Winter School*:
 - students who have already obtained a Master's or PhD degree;
 - students enrolled in a doctoral courseat an Italian or foreign university;
 - researchers from an Italian or foreign university;
 - students enrolled in a degree course of an Italian University, within the limits indicated in the following par. 4.
- 2. The minimum number of participants required to activate the *Winter School* is 15 (fifteen) candidates.
- 3. No more than 40 (forty) applications will be accepted.

At least 15 (fifteen) participants will be selected among candidates from universities other than the proposing university.

Only in the event that less than 25 (twenty-five) people apply to participate in the *Winter School*, more applications from the University of Palermo will be considered.

4. The course is also opened to students enrolled in a degree course of an Italian Universitywho are working on their degree thesis and therefore at the end of their studies.

No more than 10 (ten) students enrolled in a degree program may be selected to participate in the *Winter School*.









5. If it is necessary to make a selection (if the number of applications exceeds 40), the Scientific Committee will draw up a list of admitted participants and a waiting list. Candidates on the waiting list will be contacted if those admitted withdraw.

The selection will be made on the basis of the Curriculum vitae, the declared qualifications and a motivational letter sent by the candidate.

ART. 3 – APPLICATIONS

- 1. To register for the Winter school it is necessary to fill in and transmit the application form attached to this call, as well as the payment of the participation fee, in compliance with the procedures described in the following paragraphs.
- 2. Candidates must attach to the *application form*:
 - your Curriculum Vitae et studiorum;
 - list ofqualifications, if any; •
 - copya valid identity document;
 - copy of thereceipt certifying the payment of the registration fee;
 - motivational letter (max 250 characters).

The *application form* and the supporting documents must be sent by February 20, 2023.

ART. 4 – THE WINTER SCHOOL COURSES

1. The *Winter School* will be divided into two parts.

In the first, participants will have to study the reading materials – theoretical and practical articles, court decisions, official reports - which will be made available on the website of the PhD in "Human Rights" at least two weeks before the start of the *Winter School*:

In the second they will participate in the seminars and in the Workshop, held by speakers from Italian and foreign universities, and they will take part in the discussion with questions and answers based on the reports and on the reading of teaching materials.

- 2. The activities of the *Winter school* will take place in Palermo, Italy, at the offices of the Department of Law of the University of Palermo - Via Maqueda, 172, and Piazza Bologni, 8 - in compliance with the indications contained in the final program that will be subsequently announced. The seminars will be held between 9 a.m. and 7 p.m.
- **3.** Participants will have full and free access to the library of the Department of Law.
- 4. Students who have participated in at least 90% of the seminars will receive a certificate, which corresponds to 6 ECTS, after passing an exam.
