#### PURPOSE OF THE COURSE

The main purpose of the Course is to illustrate the most important molecular medicine progress both with the most recent clinical and diagnostics approaches in adult and elderly population with cancer. The course has been particularly designed to provide best informations to physicians about the progress of biomoleculars studies in order to improve the clinical management of Cancer in Adult or Elderly Male and Female (with over 40 specific lessons in this field of Lung, Ovarian, Colon-rectal, Renal and Prostate Cancer and 11 "lectio magistralis" to open and conclude every session)

In addition, there will be planned two workshops on specific topics as Healthy Ageing and Silver Economy both with sessions devoted to new molecular findings (descriptive and analytic epidemiology of Parkinson's diseases Stroke, Dementias, Multiple Sclerosis). A section on methodology in genetic epidemiology of neurological diseases will be planned to present the strategies and the techniques of this important field of investigation.

### PLEASE NOTE

Participants should arrive in Erice on 24 Nov. not later than 12 am.

According to legend, Erice, son of Venus and Neptune, founded a small town on top of a mountain (750 metres above sea level) more than three thousand years ago. The founder of modern history — i.e. the recording of events in a methodic and chronological sequence as they really happened without reference to mythical causes — the great Thucydides (~500 B.C.), writing about events connected with the conquest of Troy (1183 B.C.) said: «After the fall of Troy some Trojans on their escape from the Achaei arrived in Sicily by boat and as they settled near the border with the Sicanians all together they were named Elymi: their towns were Segesta and Erice.» This inspired Virgil to describe the arrival of the Trojan royal family in Erice and the burial of Anchises, by his son Aeneas, on the coast below Erice. Homer (~1000 B.C.), Theocritus (~300 B.C.), Polybius (~200 B.C.), Virgil (~50 B.C.), Horace (~20 B.C.), and others have celebrated this magnificent spot in Sicily in their poems. During seven centuries (XIII-XIX) the town of Erice was under the leadership of a local oligarchy, whose wisdom assured a long period of cultural development and economic prosperity which in turn gave rise to the many churches, monasteries and private palaces which you see today.

In Erice you can admire the Castle of Venus, the Cyclopean Walls (~800 B.C.) and the Gothic Cathedral (~1300 A.D.). Erice is at present a mixture of ancient and medieval architecture. Other masterpieces of ancient civilization are to be found in the neighbourhood: at Motya (Phoenician), Segesta (Elymian), and Selinunte (Greek). On the Aegadian Islands

— theatre of the decisive naval battle of the first Punic War (264-241 B.C.) — suggestive neolithic and paleolithic vestiges are still visible: the grottoes of Favignana, the carvings and murals of Levanzo. Splendid beaches are to be found at San Vito Lo Capo, Scopello, and Cornino, and a wild and rocky coast around Monte Cofano: all at less than one hour's drive from Erice.
