Since the arts and philosophy have become paramount in rethinking our attitude towards sustainability issues, the workshop addresses a twofold perspective: on the one side, the human approach to biodiversity protection in nature and, on the other side, the enhancement of diversity in society and the promotion of sustainable lifestyles.

Discussing recent contributions of artists and thinkers in this field, the aim of the workshop is to discuss and set the methodological structure and conceptual framework for the reconsideration of biodiversity as a transversal and transdisciplinary feature of sustainable culture and living.
