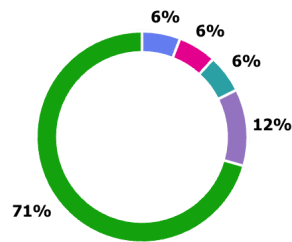


3. Age at the time of graduation



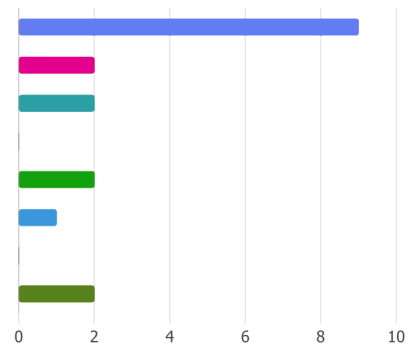

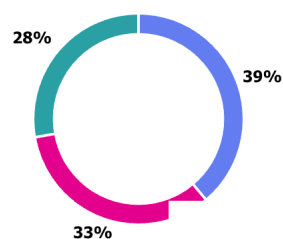

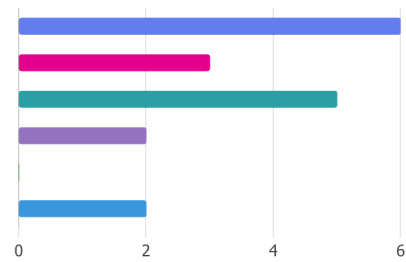
7. Relationship between your current job and the TNGS programme

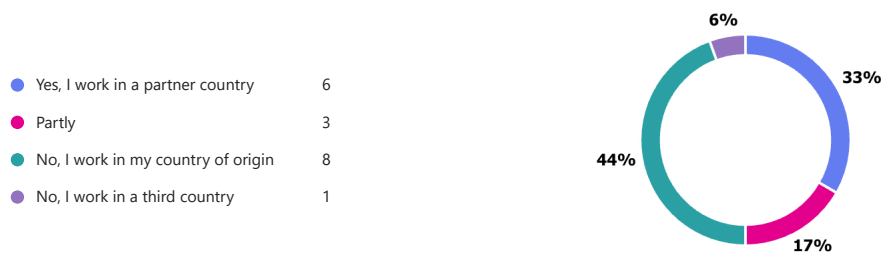

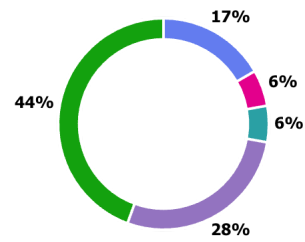

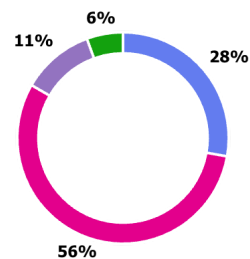

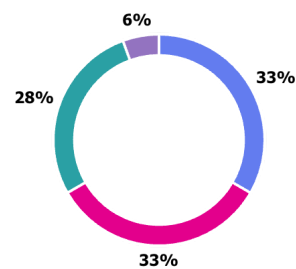
19. How important was the Erasmus Mundus Joint Degree title for your career or personal development?

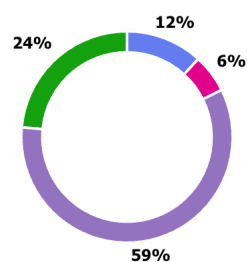
20. Recognition of the TNGS degree in your current country

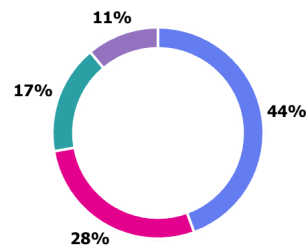
21. To what extent did studying in multiple countries influence your willingness to work internationally?

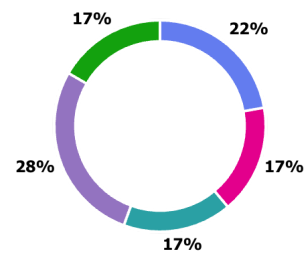
