Italian and Art Course

Italy is closely related to Art: the course "Italian and Art" is a programme that aims at increasing the knowledge of Italian language, while discovering Italian art and Made in Italy, with special reference to Sicily. The teacher of the course is fully qualified both in History of Art and in Italian as a Foreign Language.

THE TEACHER

Adele Simioli graduated in Modern Philology (*Università Federico II, Naples*), she specialised in Contemporary History of Art (*Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore, Milan*) and she completed a PhD programme in 2011 in History and Restore of Architecture (*Università La Sapienza, Rome*). She extensively researched in architecture and contemporary art in Milan (*Politecnico*) and in Rome (*Istituto per la Storia dell'Arte Lombarda* and *Centro Universitario Cattolico*). She is also specialised in teaching Italian as a second/ foreign language.

WHERE

The classroom activities will take place in the premises of the Italian Language School: the ex convent of Sant'Antonino, a building from the XVII century that has been recently and entirely refurbished. All the classrooms are all air-conditioned and they all offer a well-equipped learning environment.

ACTIVITIES

This course has a theoretical structure combined with an extensive application consisting of many educational trips to discover the masterpieces of Palermo and Sicily. The course has the aim of introducing the students to Italian art and to the specialised language of History of Art and Art Criticism with its specific lexical and syntactical features and with its textual genres (university lectures, specialised articles, essays, reviews).

WHEN

40 hours in class, 4 afternoon guided visits in Palermo, 4 daytrips in famous Sicilian places of historical and artistic interest.

FEES

400 euros. Reductions will be granted to those students booking more than one course.
