**DOUBLE MASTER DEGREE AGREEMENT**  
**BETWEEN THE**  
**UNIVERSITY OF PALERMO**  
**AND THE ALBERT-LUDWIGS-UNIVERSITÄT**

concerning the

Master Degree in “Scienze dell’Antichità” (Classe LM 15)”

awarded by the University of Palermo

and the

Master of Arts “Classical Cultures”

awarded by the Albert-Ludwigs-Universität

On one part, University of Palermo, hereinafter also referred to as the “UNIPA”, with registered office at Piazza Marina n. 61, 90133 Palermo, Italy, VAT number 00605880822, and on its behalf and represented by prof. Fabrizio Micari, Rector of the University of Palermo;

on the other part, the Albert-Ludwigs Universität in Freiburg i. Br., hereinafter also referred to as the “Albert-Ludwigs Universität”, with registered office at Fahnbergplatz, 79085 Freiburg i. Br., Germany, VAT number DE 142116817, and on its behalf and represented by Prof. Dr. Dr. h.c. Hans-Jochen Schiewer, Rector of the Albert-Ludwigs-Universität

**STATE**

1. that both institutions share cultural, technical, educational, and scientific fields of common interest;

2. that collaboration and the exchange of experience and knowledge, as well as the provision of services between both institutions, are in their greatest interest for social and cultural progress;
3. that they are interested in promoting their international collaboration in the field of higher education and research;
4. that they are both part of the Consortium “European Master in Classical Cultures”. The European Master in Classical Cultures is an internationally integrated, interdisciplinary programme in Classical Studies, supported currently by 12 partner universities from 8 European countries;

#### **THAT BEING SAID, THE PARTIES AGREE**

to sign an agreement that specifies the conditions under which students may access and opt for a double Master Degree in “Scienze dell’Antichità (Classe LM 15)” and in “Classical Cultures”. The awarding of the double Master Degree, conferred by the two Universities in accordance with the current regulations at each institution, is subject to compliance with the clauses established in this agreement.

#### **Art. 1: Purpose**

This agreement aims to establish the academic and administrative conditions under which students enrolled at the “Laurea Magistrale in Scienze dell’Antichità” at Palermo University, and students enrolled at the Master of Arts “Classical Cultures” at the Albert-Ludwigs-Universität, may access and opt for a double Master Degree conferred by both Universities, subject to compliance with the clauses established in this agreement, and in accordance with the current regulations at each institution in the current version of the time.

Both Universities consider that the two degree courses are similar and equivalent and mutually recognize the educational activities of the respective study programmes, which are listed in Annex 1 and 2.

All procedural rules will be determined in accordance with the regulations at each institution through an informal agreement between the Coordinators, on whom see 5.2.

## **Art. 2: Pre-Selection Requirements**

Students from the University of Palermo, who intend to opt for the double Master Degree in “Scienze dell’Antichità” / “Classical Cultures” must be regularly enrolled in the programme of “Scienze dell’Antichità”, and have an adequate command of the German language.

Students from the Albert-Ludwigs Universität, who intend to opt for the double Master Degree in “Scienze dell’Antichità” / “Classical Cultures”, must be regularly enrolled in the course of “Classical Cultures”, have an adequate command of the Italian language.

## **Art. 3: Selection**

The maximum number of students, which could be enrolled in the double Master Degree programme, is 6 (six) for each academic year by each University.

Each university will announce yearly the application call for participating to the double Master Degree programme.

Evaluation of the applications and applicants’ selection will be mainly based on their motivation, academic career and the level of knowledge of English, and of Italian and German as foreign languages, and of Latin and Greek due to the local regulations of each university.

Students who possess a not yet adequate level of linguistic abilities can obtain, under previous approval of the Coordinators of the double Master Degree programme (see 5.2), a conditioned admission to the programme itself. In any case, the minimum linguistic level must be reached before starting the courses at the Host University.

The student’s final admission requires approval by the Partner University and admission into its corresponding degree programme.

## **Art. 4: Enrolment. Students' rights and obligations**

### **4.1 Enrolment**

Students participating in the double Master Degree programme will enrol and will pay the enrolment fees and taxes at their Home University. At the Host University they will be exempt from application fees and course tuition during the period of the stay, with the exception of social

services contributions and smaller fees due to local rules at each university. The Host University will admit and enrol students issuing them the necessary documentation to ensure access to ordinary student services.

#### **4.2 Students' rights and obligations**

During the exchange period, the students will be subject to the rules and regulations of the Host University. Likewise, they will enjoy the same rights as students enrolled at the Host University.

If a student does not comply with the terms of this agreement, including the minimum length of the stay at the Host University and its study programme, that student will forfeit any right to receive the Master Degree from the Host University and will be excluded from the double Master Degree programme, although he/she may still be eligible to obtain the Master Degree at his/her Home University.

### **Art. 5: Organization and Didactics**

#### **5.1. Study programmes**

The two Universities elaborate and approve, through their respective academic bodies, their own Master Degree courses' study programmes, duly articulated in modules and credits (CFU/ECTS): see Annexes 1 (a-b) and 2. The study programmes must regard the entire period right through to the achievement of the diploma. Didactics is organized in semesters.

The Universities can modify their own curricula. Each University communicates promptly to the Partner prospective changes in its own curriculum.

The study programmes may provide specific lessons, considering the bi-national character of the education, and 'stages' (Praktika) at enterprises and/or public entities, also in third countries.

#### **5.2. Local Coordinators**

Each Partner University appoints a Local Coordinator for the exchange programme (see Annex 4).

The Local Coordinator:

- attends to the didactic and administrative coordination with the Partner University;

- follows, from a didactic point of view, students from his/her own University, who participate in the exchange programme, advising them on their plan of studies and remaining in contact with them for the entire duration of the programme;
- welcomes the students of the Partner University participating in the exchange, as soon as they arrive at his/her University;
- follows the students of the Partner University from a didactic point of view, advising them on their plan of studies and checking periodically the progress of their study programme during their stay at his/her Institution;
- guarantees correct administrative management of the exchange programme and is responsible for its quality control (see 5.5).

### **5.3. Student's learning activities and their recognition**

Each student admitted to the double Master Degree programme must define her/his plan of study with the assistance of the local Coordinators in accordance with the study programmes of the Home and Host University. The responsible academic bodies - supported by the local coordinators – will establish, case-by-case, correspondences between the learning activities carried out by the student in the Partner University and the educational offer of their own University (see Annex 2).

When organizing the stay, the academic calendar of each University will be considered. The students participating in the double Master Degree programme must attend one semester at the Partner University and they must achieve there a minimum of 30 (thirty) credits (CFU/ECTS).

All students admitted to the double Master Degree programme must register at the Host University and present at their arrival the transcript of records of the courses already taken at their Home University.

The Host Universities undertake to award students of the Partner University a transcript of records of the courses taken during their stay. The certificate must be issued in English.

After completing the stay, the students must submit to their Home University the official transcript of records issued by the Host University in order to receive credit for the courses taken.

### **5.5 Quality control**

Both Coordinators of the double Master Degree programme will meet, also by video conference, at least once in a year, to evaluate the effectiveness of the learning programme and the results

achieved by students, as well as the resources supplied by both Universities. To improve the quality of the programme, the Coordinators could suggest modifications and propose them to the competent boards of both Universities. Substantial changes to structure, organisation, and in evaluation mechanisms of the programme could be implemented through amendments to this text.

## **Art. 6: Funding, Expenses, Insurance**

### **6.1. Teaching staff**

The two Universities can cover the travel and living expenses of their professors sent abroad to the Partner University within the double Master Degree programme, depending on available financial resources. These business trips can also take place within the framework of other mobility programmes.

### **6.2 Students**

Transport costs, medical insurance, accommodations, upkeep, and any other expenses the student will incur during the exchange period established in the double Master Degree programme will be charged to the student. The partner university pledges to provide assistance in the search for suitable accommodations through its administrative offices. The students involved can apply for scholarships or other financial aid instruments to cover the mobility costs. Each University may assign grants to its own students partaking in the joint study programme on the basis of appropriate selection call for candidates.

Participating Students must have an adequate insurance cover which meets the requirements at the Universities. The students are responsible for obtaining the insurance cover. The host institution does not have any requirement to provide health or personal damages insurance for the hosted students. For the enrolment at Albert-Ludwigs-University participating students are required to prove coverage by a health insurance.

## **Art. 7: Administration/Technical Staff Reference Persons**

The non-teaching staff reference persons for the exchange at University of Palermo are listed in the Annex 3a.

The non-teaching staff reference persons at the Albert-Ludwigs-Universität are listed in the Annex 3b.

#### **Art. 8: Teaching Staff Reference Persons**

The teaching staff reference persons (= Coordinators) for the exchange at the University of Palermo are listed in the Annex 4a.

The teaching staff reference persons (= Coordinators) for the exchange at the Albert-Ludwigs-Universität are listed in the Annex 4b.

#### **Art. 9: Teaching Methodology and Evaluation**

During the study period, students participating to the double Master Degree programme will take part in the teaching activities of the Host University as they are regularly carried out. Courses are taught in the language of the host country.

The participating students will be evaluated according to the same criteria and with the same methodology regularly used at the Host University.

#### **Art. 10: Final Degree Exam**

At the end of their bi-national study programme, students will prepare a Master's thesis under the supervision of a professor of each University. The final degree exam will be held at the Home University and the elaborate will be completed by a summary (between a minimum of 5 [five] and a maximum of 10 [ten] pages) written in the language of the Host University. The supervisor from the Host University will be invited to be part, also by videoconference, of the committee of the final examination, which will be hence accordingly integrated or enlarged. If the supervisor from the Host University should not be able to personally intervene, he/she will send a report with his/her evaluation, which will be taken into account by the committee of the final examination in the Home University to the extent that it is legally permissible.

### **Art. 11: Requirements for Awarding the Degree**

After the final exam in his/her Home University, provided that the student has fulfilled his/her duties at the Host University as well, the Host University will award the degree upon submission by the student of degree application, upon sending of a transcript from his/her Home University recording the final exam.

### **Art. 12: Settlement of Controversies**

Controversies concerning the interpretation and fulfilment of the agreed terms and conditions will be settled by mutual assent. If necessary, the settlement of controversies shall be entrusted to an Arbitration Court composed by 3 (three) members, one appointed respectively by each party, and the third chosen by mutual consent.

### **Art 13: Duration and Termination**

This agreement will take effect from the time of its signing by the representatives of both Universities, and will be valid for a period of 8 (eight) years. Following this period, the agreement may be renewed by written consent. Either one of the signatory institutions may terminate this agreement in writing, which must be sent to the partner institution 6 (six) months in advance. If one institution wishes to terminate this agreement, both pledge to meet their commitments to the students admitted into the double Master Degree programme before either one withdraws from it.

Moreover, the signature of this agreement does not mean any financial fulfilment to the parties.

### **Art. 14: Academic and research exchanges**

With the aim of supporting the double Master Degree programme, the University of Palermo and the Albert-Ludwigs-Universität will promote and coordinate by mutual consent the exchange of visiting professors and researchers as well as the organisation of workshop, seminars, conferences and publications on topics of common interest. The exchange and the development of the activities above mentioned will conform to the norms and procedures in force in the two institutions.

### Art. 15: Use of Logo

The Partners mutually commit not to use the name and/or logo or any other identifying marks of the other University for purposes other than those covered by the agreement, or for communication initiatives on this double degree programme. The right to use the name and/or logo or any other identifying marks of the other University as described in sentence 1 is limited to the duration of the Agreement.

### Art. 16: Personal data treatment

Universities will arrange for the treatment, the dissemination and communication of personal data in pursuit of their institutional goals and as provided by law.

### Art. 17: Final Clauses

This agreement is drawn up in 2 (two) copies in English, each of these texts being equally authentic. Both parties will receive one copy. All misinterpretations will be settled by mutual assent. Annexes 1 (a-b) and 2 can be modified by informal agreement between the parties. Each institution communicates to the Partner any change that should affect Annexes 3 (a-b) and 4 (a-b).
